## INTERVIEW WITH MR POURUSH SOOD - UPSC: Rank 29



Q1. To begin on a congratulatory note, how do you feel about being a civil servant?

A It bestows a lot of responsibility, your life changes as soon as you become a civil servant. You have to ensure, keep a track on all social media, be aware of your surroundings because now is the time that you serve the country, so whatever you speak, has a weightage; you have to be very mindful of what you speak; that is the big change that happens once you crack the exam.

Q2. What is your primary aim now that you have acquired this position and how do you plan to contribute to the nation's development roadmap?

A My primary goal, in the short term is to study further and basically equip myself with the knowledge I need to fulfill my responsibilities of a civil servant. I did not have a habit of reading books earlier, but now I am in the process of improving my reading, writing and speaking skills; for all these are necessary for discharging my responsibilities in the future and now to contribute to the nation's development

roadmap I plan on understanding the all-round realities of the problems, issues and everyday lives of the people right now. So, for example, my recent village and district visits wherein I got a very new perspective on what my priorities should be and what good we can perform. Also, we must learn from other countries and focus on what we can give to them as well. The exchange of best practices is essential and I want to contribute in this domain. Given my technical background, I would also want to work in the field of AI, electronics, policies; not just domestic, but also foreign policies.

Q3. 'Success is a journey, not a destination.' Since independence, hasn't India embodied the same journey? What are your thoughts on this?

A Yes, for sure. We in India have set up such high goals and we are working towards them. Becoming a great power won't happen overnight. We need to spend time, and that is what we are doing-we are attracting investments, improving manufacturing, increasing the economy. So, I think success is a journey and India is well-placed in this



journey and definitely in this time of Amrit Kaal (75 years of Independence)

Q4. Out of your time as a JHPian, which memory manages to trigger the best emotions? What makes you nostalgic about your school days?

A (smiles) I think my friends in JHPS. I hold them in high regard, and as I said I am meeting them every evening since the week I have come to Hyderabad from New Delhi.

- The time that I spent with my friends here, be it group activities, or assemblies, or in classes together, taking part in public speaking activities, the House events, quizzes and debates, the Sports day, it was a lot of fun and memorable. But the best memories are with friends, doing something together.



Q5. What do you do to unwind? Any hobbies?

A Oh yes, I have developed a lot of hobbies. I like to sing, I like to dance, I am also into dramatics, and some gaming as well. And, I also run, sometimes. All these are activities

that I kind of perform alternatively on a daily basis.

Q6. How did your engineering background influence your UPSC preparations? What advice would you like to give to the current MPC students aspiring for UPSC? Any specific tips?

A Thank you, a very technical question. In the UPSC examination, we are supposed to clear nine exams. Nine subjective exams which involve Geography, History, whatever you take for granted right now. I remember how I studied my NCERT back in school and particularly, for my examination. There's a huge difference and those books are good, by the way, so just try to read them properly and understand what is happening. We have exams on not just Geography, but also ethics, there are a lot of subjects. Two exams out of these are on optional subjects - History, Geography, Engineering - all of them. I had taken up Math as my optional subject and that is because, firstly I am an engineer, with some mathematical background and secondly I really loved solving Math questions and that was just one benefit I had. It is observed that people from humanities and commerce have an edge because they have already studied Social Science in class 11 and 12. But, Math helped me get a very good rank. I would advise, though it is extremely amazing that you have this UPSC goal at this stage. But, you are preparing for IIT in MPC

so I would suggest get into a good college and keep the UPSC goal on the back burner for now; you can start on the preparation in college. I think the habit of reading newspapers won't just help you with UPSC but also make you a much more informed and aware citizen and a well-rounded individual. It lets you know about different opinions. I would suggest you to inculcate it.



Q7. Did you plan to write UPSC exams way before?

A It was after I left college. In colleges other than Humanities, you are in a shell. In my college days, I knew everything about the latest developments in electronics field and so did not read newspapers. Once I got out, I began reading the news, I started knowing more about my surroundings and developed an interest for the UPSC examination.

Q8. What would your suggestion be to the current batch of grade 10 to cope up with distractions and stress while preparing for any competitive exam?

A Of course, you will soon be writing such exams to enter good colleges. I would say, have an hour or so for yourself where you can do whatever you like.

For example, my target was to study for 10-12 hours on holidays and sleep for 8 hours. In the remaining 4 to 6 hours I did whatever I liked. That was a good de-stresser. Don't go overboard with it, I would say.



Q9. Who inspired you to crack UPSC?

A I was watching a TV series called Veep about the Vice President of the US. In it, there was a character who was a diplomat. That character gave me inspiration, though once you start preparing, the strategies of previous year's toppers also help. I had a senior in my college- she inspired me as well.

Q10. Who exactly is an IAS in your opinion?

A That sounds like an interview question! An IAS has a lot of power to make decisions affecting thousands of lives. Where you land your priorities is the discretion you get as an IAS officer. I think it's a big responsibility and a skilled IAS officer is one who has a lot of ethics but has a balanced approach to where he gives priorities.

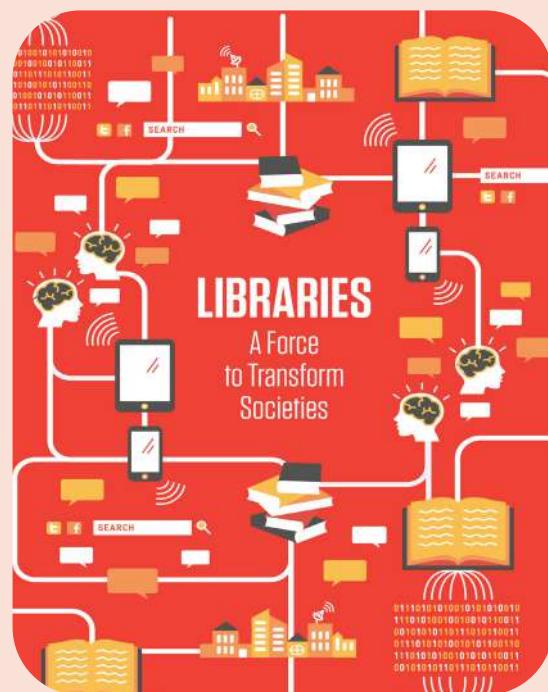

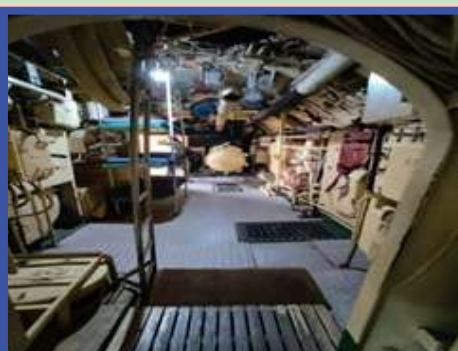


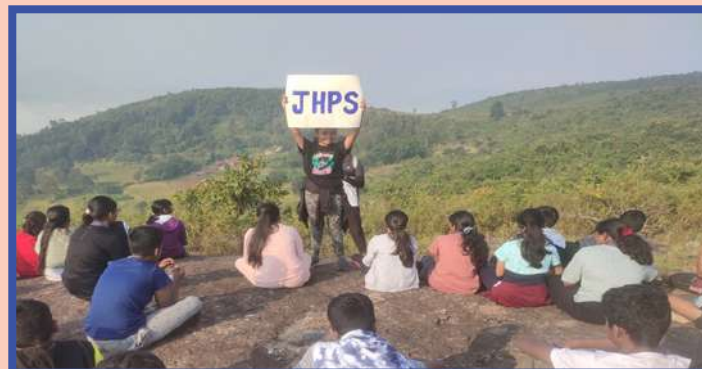


## ***EXCURSION - VIZAG AND ARAKU VALLEY***

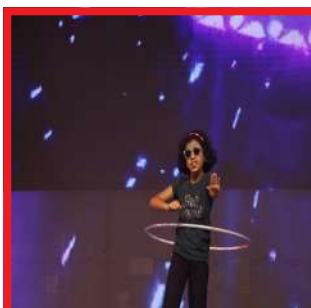

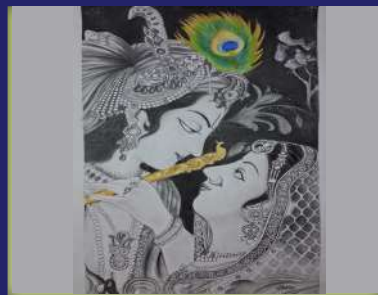

## Webinar - Social Media for Education

The teachers of JHPS participated in the CIET-NCERT-organized webinar on Social Media for Education, which took place on June 14th, 2023.

The resource persons Prof. Anubhuti Yadav and Dr. Gaurav Singh enlightened the teachers in detail about the various social media sites and the pros and cons associated with the various social media platforms. They also enumerated the safety tips that the users need to be aware of while engaging with social media sites.

According to Professor Anubhuti Yadav, social media serves as a valuable instrument in the field of education. Social media encompasses more than mere social networking applications such as Facebook.

Prof. Anubhuti Yadav discussed about micro moments of social media. Micro moments refer to those instances when individuals instinctively divert their attention towards their smartphone in order to retrieve information. The micro moments explained by her are

1. I-Want-to-know moments,
2. I-Want-to-Do moments and
3. I-Want-to-Prepare moments

She provided a concise explanation regarding online platforms. Individuals opt for online platforms when their curiosity arises. These platforms not only provide information but also engage with users during the process. This interaction can be as basic as seeking comments or enabling voting on an article. On the contrary, social media operates as a two-way street,

facilitating communication as well.

According to Professor Anubhuti, social media encompasses various aspects such as:

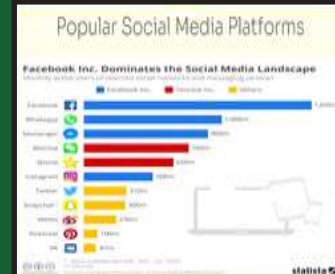
1. Social bookmarking
2. Social news
3. Social networking
4. Sharing photos and videos on social platforms
5. Wikis
6. Any website that encourages user interaction and engagement, both within the site and with other visitors, falls under the category of social media.

Dr. Gaurav provided an explanation that social media is a technology rooted in computers, enabling the exchange of ideas, thoughts, and information by establishing virtual networks and communities.

Below are social media safety tips provided by Dr. Gaurav:

1. Exercise caution when sharing excessive information.
2. Modify your privacy settings accordingly.
3. Restrict the amount of work history details you disclose.
4. Ensure to verify the identity of individuals you connect with.

It was a fruitful session with lots of important takeaways.



## 'COPING WITH STRESS AND INTERPERSONAL RELATIONSHIP'

JHPS teachers attended a workshop on COPING WITH STRESS AND INTERPERSONAL RELATIONSHIP organized on 5th June, 2023 at school premises.

- Ms. Kanchana defined stress as 'Thoughts and behaviours associated when you are worried or not in a mental state to make decisions.' Some of the physical signs of stress are headache, neck or shoulder pain, back pain, upset stomach, not feeling hungry, lump in the throat, heavy chest, tight muscles etc.,
- She quoted an example of Benjamin Franklin which states that Stress is often termed as twentieth century syndrome, born out of man's race towards modern progress and its ensuing complexities. She differentiated between Eustress (positive stress) and Distress (negative stress).
- She focused on Physical, Behaviour and Mental Effects of Stress. Also discussed about Stress Curve, advantages, and disadvantages of stress.
- She briefed about 4 A's to Stress Management i.e., Avoid (unnecessary stress) Alter (the situation), Adapt (to the situation) and Accept (the things you cannot change).
- She discussed about Interpersonal Skills- its importance and why one should possess them. These skills help a person to build and maintain relationship, working environment, leadership qualities and all-round success.
- She focused on certain qualities which improve Interpersonal skills such as smiling, appreciating, paying attention, practicing humour, resolving conflicts, and communicating clearly, being empathetic and not complaining.
- She focused on ABC Strategy Awareness- What are the factors that drive you to stress? Balance-How to deal with stress? - Controlling/ reducing stress by listening to music, making friends, by cracking jokes and to be thankful with what you have.
- It is important to give time for self and to the other in a managed way so that stressors could handle the situation effectively.
- All of the above tips given in the session seemed very useful and efficient to reduce the stress. There were discussions in between and at the end of the session doubts and queries were resolved. The session gave the teachers an opportunity to learn how to manage stress in their daily lives.

## IN-SERVICE TRAINING ON LANGUAGE - TEACHING & LEARNING

A training session was carried out for the English Department on, 5th May, 2023, at Jubilee Hills Public School by Dr. Gururaj. The workshop's main area of focus was Language Teaching and Learning. He centered his remarks on outlining different teaching strategies that a teacher might apply in a classroom. Due to this, the session was engaging and energetic.

Dr. Gururaj highlighted that the fundamental goal of this program is to provide comprehensive insights into the language teaching methodology, which is a theoretical view of what language is and how it may be learned. The best method of learning is experiential learning. It enables students to retain knowledge more effectively and imparts lessons that can be applied throughout life. Both the teacher and the student gain from experiential learning because it allows teachers to experiment with new concepts and methods that they would use in the classroom. It also allows students to participate in what they are learning in a way that is enjoyable and beneficial for everyone.

He gave an overview of the constructivist method, which is based on the concept that meaningful learning occurs when students actively create their own knowledge. The primary idea of the constructivist framework is that knowledge is gained through experience and reflection. It develops social and communication skills by participating in group projects, in which students can

practice communicating their ideas clearly and work effectively as a team.

Additionally, he stated that the constructivist approach consists of five stages: welcoming ideas, exploring, making a proposition, explaining, providing a solution, and execution. When it comes to student's work, the constructivist classroom also emphasizes daily tasks.

He stated that discourse-oriented pedagogy helps students to understand individual opinions and values on a deeper level. It helps a student become understandable and enables them to gain knowledge and higher-order thinking ability. He mentioned that the communicative approach is based on the concept that acquiring a language requires meaningful content. Learners will apply their innate language acquisition strategies when engaging in actual conversation, which will help them, pick up the language. Through repeated oral practice and peer collaboration, communicative language instruction techniques enable students to communicate confidently in a variety of real-life circumstances.

He concluded by explaining New English Treasure as a comprehensive English education focused on the communication strategy. The new edition of the series adheres to the recommended educational method and practices mentioned in the National Education Policy (2020). The purpose is to provide opportunities for holistic teaching and learning for both teachers and students.

## INSERVICE WORKSHOP MATH DEPARTMENT

A workshop for Math department was held on 6th June, 2023. The resource person for the session was Mr. Deepankar Banik. He explained the aim of implementing NEP 2020, CPA (Concrete Pictorial Abstract). He emphasized that this will help children with Mathophobia (fear of Math) to remove their fear of Math and embrace Mathophilia (love for Math).

He illustrated the importance of numeracy and literacy – forming an integral part for overall development which would further help us in reasoning – a base for cracking competitive exams/boards and experiential learning. He also said that Vedic and modern math combined to create speed math.

Importance of self-teaching make children develop the habit of reading books, making own notes and mind map. He explained the difference between 'STEM and STEAM' learning.

The teacher should be a spiritual-source of inspiration so that students get a positive approach for learning Maths.

## INSERVICE TRAINING SOCIAL SCIENCE DEPARTMENT

An in-service training for Social Science Department was conducted by Macmillan Education, on 5th June 2023. The resource person was Ms. Aishwarya Upadhaya. She started the session with Shayari followed by an activity, 'Exploring you'. She covered a few topics on Social Science Education.

Each topic is explored with the help of an activity and reflecting on it. She emphasized on NCF which defines Social Science as a systemic study of human society and the relationship between the individual and society, social institutions, and organizations.

Ms. Aishwarya explained that the social science is a systematic study of human society and the relationship between the individual and society, social institutions, and organizations. She also explored that the heart of social science education lays an understanding of the world, the diverse concerns of human society, and participating in it as empathetic and responsible citizens.

She conducted an activity to show the road map of one's own experience of being a social teacher – to show first day as a social teacher and the present day social teacher. Teachers participated actively and gave their presentation enthusiastically.



## INSERVICE TRAINING HINDI AND TELUGU DEPARTMENT

In-service training plays a crucial role in the continuous professional development of teachers, enabling them to stay current with the latest pedagogical approaches, curriculum updates, and advancements in their respective subject areas. When it comes to subjects like Hindi, Telugu, in-service training becomes even more vital due to the specific skills and knowledge required to effectively teach and engage students in these areas.

Hindi and Telugu are two of the most widely spoken languages in India, with Hindi the official language and Telugu primarily spoken in the state of Andhra Pradesh and Telangana. In-service training focused on these languages can improve teachers' proficiency, enhance their ability to teach language skills effectively, and ensure that students receive a high-quality education in their mother tongues. 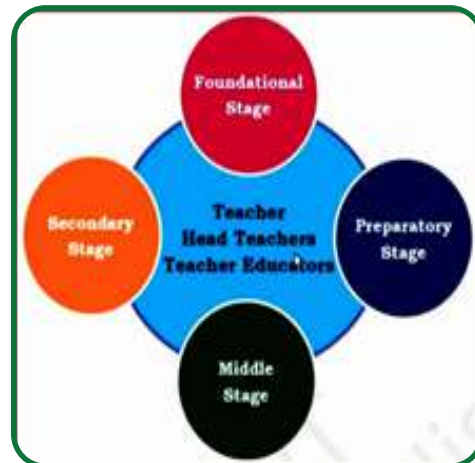
## ONLINE SUPER SUNDAY WORKSHOP ON SCHOOL LEADER CERTIFICATION ACTION PLAN 2023

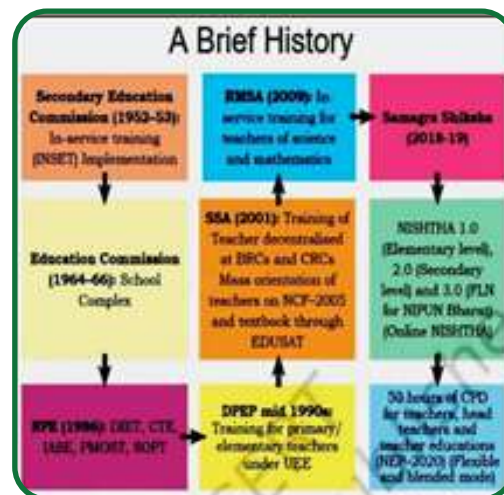





## Jhpiian Hemesh Chadalavada, listed as a Young Prodigy by TOI in September 2023

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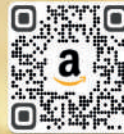
